Board Meetings

Board meetings begin at 6 p.m. typically on the first Thursday of each month at the Education Center, 14160 Black Bob Road. Special meetings may be called to conduct business which cannot be deferred to the next regular meeting.

The primary role of the Board of Education is to transact the business of the school district. The board recognizes its responsibility for proper governance, and therefore the need to conduct its business in an orderly, transparent and efficient manner.

Board agendas are provided each meeting in the lobby of the Education Center. Patrons may also find the agenda and supporting items on the district’s website, www.olatheschools.org (in Board Docs, under the Board of Education).

Patron Input

Patrons are able to address the board in the Public Comments section of the regular board meeting. Patrons wishing to address the board are asked to contact the Clerk of the Board (Joy Bondurant, 913-780-8022, jbondurantec@olatheschools.org) prior to noon on the day of the meeting giving their name, address, and subject to be addressed. Forms are available the evening of the board meeting and also on the Board Docs agenda.

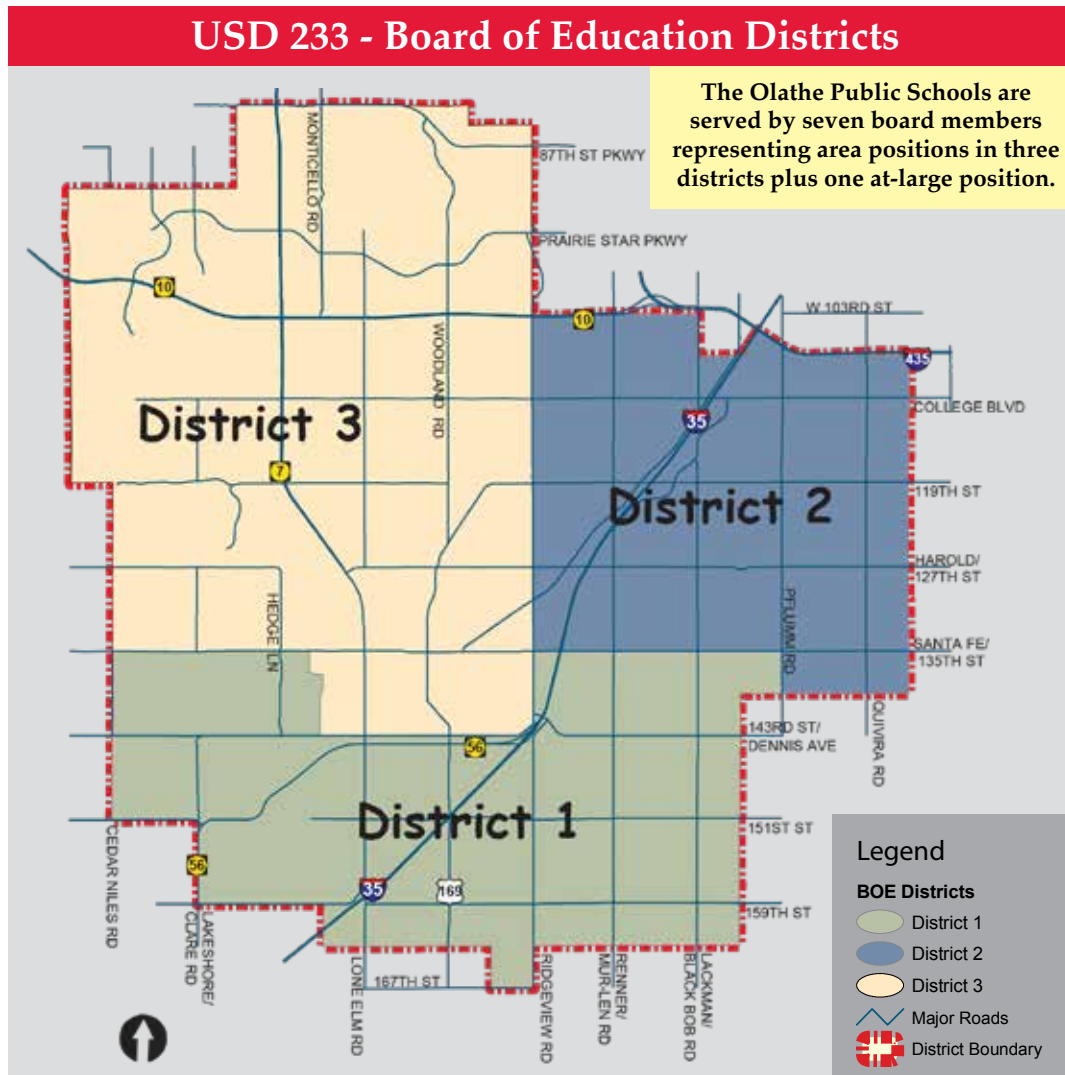
Though the board appreciates public comment, they ask that patrons first go through proper school channels to solve issues.

If addressing the board, please:

- Complete the information form from the clerk of the board prior to the beginning of the board meeting.
- When called upon, come up the center aisle and use the microphone at the podium in the front of the room.
- Introduce yourself by stating your name and address.
- Speakers are limited to five minutes, and are encouraged not to use personal attacks and to be professional, concise and respectful.
- If using a prepared statement, please have copies for the clerk and the board.

Executive Session

Once a formal motion is made, seconded and carried (with the reason for the meeting stated), the board may recess to executive session for discussion. Topics to be discussed in executive session are limited to matters such as: non-elected personnel, real estate acquisitions, security, negotiations or consultation with attorneys.
