Step 1. Select a novel from the list provided below. To challenge yourself and to give your teacher an accurate picture of where you are as a student, please select a book that you have not previously read.

Reading the novel, creating effective annotations, and taking notes will prepare you for a timed writing, which will occur at the beginning of the semester.

- Annotate carefully and thoroughly the growth of the characters throughout the novel.
