

Affordability – Cost

Type of College	Average Tuition and Fees for Two Years	Average Tuition and Fees for Two Years at a Community College	Two-year Savings Potential
Four-year public university (in-state)	\$21,120	\$7,540	\$13,580
Four-year public university (out-of-state)	\$54,040	\$7,540	\$46,500
Four-year private university	\$75,300	\$7,540	\$67,760



Affordability – Scholarships/Aid

CavGuarantee

\$1,000 scholarship

- Disbursed to you over your first two semesters

Who's Eligible

- High School students who reside in Johnson County and who graduate with a 3.25 unweighted GPA.
- Can cover almost 40% of your tuition

President's Scholarship


Full ride to JCCC for two years

- \$300 book scholarship per semester

Who's Eligible

- High School students who reside in Johnson County and who have at least a 3.5 unweighted GPA.
- One student per Johnson County High School




50%-70% of students change majors at least 1x
