
Communications (5 Credits)

- English.....4 Credits
- Applied Communications...1 Credit



Humanities (4 Credits)

- Visual or Performing Art..... 1 Credit
- Social Science..... 3 Credits
 - One credit of Modern World History (grade 9)
 - One credit of United States History (grade 11)
 - One half-credit of US Government (grade 12)
 - One half-credit of social science elective (grade 9 -12, recommended grade 10)



Math /
Science /
Technology
(6.5 Credits)

- Mathematics..... 3 Credits
- Science..... 3 Credits
 - One credit Life Science
 - One credit Physical Science
 - One additional credit Life or Physical Science
- Technology..... .5 Credit



Life Skills (2.5 Credits)

- Practical & Consumer Studies..... 1 Credit
- Consumer Personal Finance..... .5 Credit
- Health & Wellness..... 1 Credit
 - Physical Education, which includes a health component, is required for freshmen.



Individual Focus (6 Credits)

- Individual focus credits are additional courses taken that are not included in the specific course areas for graduation.
- They can be from any area.

NCAA / NAIA ELIGIBILITY

- Register w/ the NCAA Eligibility Center by the end of sophomore year.
- See counselor if you are planning on participating in athletics at the collegiate level.
- Page 11 of PPG has additional information.
- Not all classes are NCAA approved.

Summer Government (Class of 2022)

- Permission must be obtained through contacting your current counselor. Enroll through the E-Academy website AFTER Spring Break of your Junior year.
- Suggest that you receive a “C” or better in your current U.S. History Class.
- Expected to dedicate, at least, 2 hrs. a day.
- Must attend an enrollment meeting and an on-site final.
- \$200 fee to take the course

- AVID 9, 10, 11, 12
- Gifted Services
- Resource
- Peer Mentor
- AP Studies – Study hall for 11&12 grade students who are enrolled in two or more honors/accelerated courses. Pass/Fail credit is awarded. Students interested in signing up for this course need to see Mrs. McKinney in the counseling office.
- Guided Study – Study Hall for 9-12 grade students. Pass/fail credit is awarded. Recommendations for this course are made by teacher, administrator, or counselor. If you are interested in signing up for this class or have taken it in previous years, please see your counselor.

Special Courses

Tryout Classes

- Any course, on the grade-level enrollment form, that has an asterisk next to it is a try-out class
- You can't enroll in the course during the pre-enrollment period
- Must get an application and apply (pick up application from teacher/sponsor of that class/activity)
- Please indicate, on the grade-level enrollment form, which class you would like to drop if you are selected for the try-out class

SOPHOMORE (class of 2024) – English, Math, Physical
Science/Chemistry, Social Studies Elective

JUNIOR (class of 2023) – English, Math, Science, U.S.

SENIOR (class of 2022) – English, Math, Government

Pre-Selected Courses

Sophomore Class of 2024

- English, Physical Science/Chemistry (locked), Math (locked)

Junior Class of 2023

- English, Math (locked), U.S. History

Senior Class of 2022

- English (locked), Math, Government

IF YOU FEEL THAT ONE OF YOUR LOCKED COURSES IS NOT THE APPROPRIATE PLACEMENT, PLEASE CONSULT YOUR CURRENT TEACHER. YOUR CURRENT TEACHER WILL NOTIFY MRS. MCKINNEY THAT A CHANGE SHOULD BE MADE.

REMINDER

- It is USD 233 School Board Policy for all students to enroll in a full 7-hour school day.
- ALL students are required to enroll in 7 credits (14 classes) and 2 alternate credits (4 classes) regardless of participation in OATC, Shortened Day, Early Graduation, 21st Century Internships, etc.
- Changes to accommodate these programs will be made after the pre-enrollment process.

Please be make sure that you have met the necessary **prerequisites** when selecting a course or are currently fulfilling that prerequisite this semester.

Schedule Change Policy

- Student selections during pre-enrollment are used to create the master schedule.
- Students will not qualify for a schedule change, for the 2021-2022 school year, if their schedule reflects courses that were requested during the pre-enrollment process (that is now). If a student is placed in a class that he/she did not choose during pre-enrollment, they can set up an appointment with their counselor at the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year.

- 2 Alternate Credits (4 classes)
 - Must be semester courses. **NO** year-long classes (A & B section) can be selected as an alternate course.

 - **DO NOT** forget this step
 - If forgotten you will not be enrolled
