

# MEETING GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Must get a passing grade to earn credit
- D (60% or higher) is considered a passing grade
- Once an "F" is earned it becomes a permanent part of your transcript
  - Core classes and Consumer Personal Finance are courses that **MUST** be made up through our credit recovery program IF an "F" is earned
- Please see your counselor for credit recovery options

# WHAT IS GPA?

## Grade Point Average

Represents average of grades earned

Used to determine class rank

Have 6 semesters to build your GPA

- A = 4 points
- B = 3 points
- C = 2 points
- D = 1 point
- F = no points

# NCAA

- Register w/ the eligibility center during sophomore year
- 16 Core Credits (foreign language counts as core)
  - 10 must be completed prior to senior year
- ACT/SAT Required
- Grade Point Average
- Refer to Program Planning Guide or NCAA or NAIA web sites.
- Information is also on the Counseling Website
- Credit Recovery through Edgenuity is not NCAA approved

# ACT AND/OR SAT

**Advise students to take Junior year**

**Plan to take 2–4 times to maximize results**

- Must register and pay online with [actstudent.org](http://actstudent.org)
- Tests are given on Saturday
- BEST preparation is doing well in rigorous classes
- Test prep is available (see counseling website)

**October 12 testing day options**

- PreACT 8/9
- PSAT: students that want to take the PSAT must register for it through TouchBase by October 6 (\$20)

# KC Scholars

- Scholarship opportunity for freshmen
- KC Scholars provides the means – through scholarships, financial incentives to promote college savings, and support services – for low- and modest-income students and adults needing access to pursue and complete a postsecondary credit-bearing credential or degree.
- Freshmen can apply for the College Savings Match
- Application required – see Mr. Wynn in Counseling Office to find out more information

# OATC

- Located on Olathe North campus
- 2 year program– Junior & Senior year
- Tour and apply during Fall of soph year
- Permission Forms in Counseling Office
- Apply– November/December
- Must be on track to graduate with little to no need for credit recovery
- NOT a transfer program– Students attend South partial day and OATC for the other part of their day
- Transportation provided to and from South for am session only
