Master of Arts in Teaching with Emphasis in Secondary Restricted

License: Secondary Restricted (Content Specific) (i.e Math, Science, History)

The Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT), with an emphasis in secondary (content specific), is an online program for anyone who holds a BS or BA degree in a teaching content area and seeks licensure to teach, in a secondary setting. Candidates are admitted in cohorts to the 36-credit hour program each summer. This alternative licensure program allows access to the restricted teaching license in the state of Kansas. Candidates in the program can teach full time in an accredited Kansas school with an offer of appropriate employment. Candidates who are not employed must complete a student teaching semester (16 weeks) in an accredited school.

Admission Requirements

- Undergraduate content degree; 3.0 GPA
- Participate in a Disposition Assessment
- Background check

Application Procedures

Candidate must:

- Apply through the Office of Graduate Studies
- Submit a transcript to be audited by PSU licensure officer
- Provide two complete recommendation forms
- Successfully complete the appropriate Praxis subject Assessment exam.
- Successfully complete admission requirements
