# EXPLORE OUR HIGH SCHOOL PATHWAY OPTIONS

## Pathway #1: Registered Teacher Apprenticeship (KSDE)

### Take Pathway and/or College Courses

Take pathway courses and some dual credit courses from a local community college or 4-year institution while in high school

### Graduate from High School

Graduate with some college credits and apply to be an apprentice in your home school district for the following school year

### Begin Registered Teacher Apprenticeship

Begin work as a paid apprentice and be assigned a mentor teacher to guide you as you learn to be a teacher

### Enter Teacher Apprentice Program™

While working as an apprentice, begin taking online courses through the Teacher Apprentice Program to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in Early Childhood Unified/Elementary Education

## Pathway #2: Paraeducator in a School District

### Take Pathway and/or College Courses

Take pathway courses and some dual credit courses from a local community college or 4-year institution while in high school

### Graduate from High School

Graduate with some college credits and apply to be a paraprofessional in a school district for the following school year

### Begin Work as a Paraprofessional

Begin a new position as a paraprofessional in a classroom to gain practical, hands-on experience

While working as a paraprofessional, begin taking online courses through the Teacher Apprentice Program to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree in Early Childhood Unified/Elementary Education
