





Admission to the Kansas Board of Regents Universities



Qualified Admissions

The six state universities in Kansas-Emporia State University, Fort Hays State University, Kansas State University, Pittsburg State University, The University of Kansas, and Wichita State University--use the standards below, set by the Kansas Board of Regents, to review applicants for undergraduate admission.

ACCREDITED HIGH SCHOOL

Freshman applicants, under the age of 21, who graduate from an accredited high school, will be guaranteed admission to six state universities by meeting the Qualified Admissions requirements designated by each university, as follows:

ESU, PSU, FHSU, & WSU:

Cumulative High School GPA 2.25+ or ACT 21+ (SAT 1060)*

K-State:

• Cumulative High School GPA 3.25+ or ACT 21+ (SAT 1060)*

KU:

Cumulative High School GPA 3.25+
 OR Cumulative GPA 2.0+ and ACT 21+ (SAT 1060)*

ALL Institutions Require:

• Cumulative GPA 2.0+ for College Credits earned in High School

KANSAS SCHOLARS CURRICULUM IS <u>RECOMMENDED BUT NOT REQUIRED</u>: To best prepare for the rigor of college-level courses, the Kansas Scholars curriculum is recommended.

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
NCAA Division I Full Qualifier:

Requirements for Athletics Aid, Practice and Competition

Students will need to meet the following requirements to receive athletics aid, practice and compete their first year:

- 16 core courses in the following areas:
 - 4 years English;
 - 3 years math at Algebra I level or higher;
 - 2 years natural or physical science (one lab if offered at any high school attended);
 - 1 year additional English, math or natural/physical science;
 - · 2 years social science; and
 - 4 years additional from areas above or foreign language, philosophy or comparative religion.
- Minimum required GPA:
 - Minimum GPA of 2.300 in those 16 core courses.
- Graduate from high school.

Grades in High School

- Semester grades are the only ones that appear on a student's transcript.
- The Grade Point Average (GPA) will be figured at the end of each semester and is cumulative; it will impact scholarship and admission decisions.
- Weighted credit is awarded in selective courses.

Weighted Grades

Weighted courses represent the most rigorous learning standards and content requiring the highest level of student performance and time commitment. The weighted grading system is used to determine academic student honors and distinctions.

The weighted grade formula is figured by using the standard grade point average and adding weighted value. The weighted value is computed by taking the number of weighted courses and dividing it by the number of semesters multiplied by seven: Weighted GPA = (GPA) + (# of Weighted Courses with grades of A, B, or C) / 7(# of semesters).

A weighted grade can be attained for the courses below by achieving class grades of A, B, or C. All courses on the list below have an equal weighted grade value:

Enrollment Process

- High School counselors work with each grade level and visit feeder middle schools
- 8th grade students receive enrollment info at their middle school
- Student will complete enrollment online through StudentVue (not ParentVue)
- ON Counselors meet back with 8th grade starting Feb 4th to check online enrollment/lock. Dates vary for every MS




Enrollment Process cont...

- 9th grade Core classes will be pre-selected
 BUT can be changed (except Math)
- PE locked, but can be removed with parent email to counselor
- Consider best enrollment choices for your student (Example: Honors English 9 vs. English 9)
- Provide alternates in which student actually has interest (students will likely receive an alternate!)
