NAMED 2025 KANSAS MASTER TEACHER

Olathe Northwest High School science and engineering teacher Andrew Taylor was named a 2025 Kansas Master Teacher on Wednesday, Feb. 12.

The Kansas Master Teacher awards, established by Emporia State University (ESU) in 1954, recognize educators who demonstrate exceptional teaching qualities. A committee including representatives from the Kansas Association of Principals, Kansas Association of School Boards, Kansas State Board of Education, Kansas Parent Teacher Organization, Kansas National Education Association, United School Administrators, ESU's Kappa Delta Pi student organization, and the 2024 Master Teacher class selected the recipients.

Taylor learned of the honor through a phone call from Dr. Sara Schwerdtfeger, interim dean of ESU's Teachers College.

"We are incredibly proud that Andrew Taylor was named an ESU Master Teacher," said Dr. Brent Yeager, Olathe Public Schools superintendent. "This is a huge accomplishment for a teacher in our state, and we want to congratulate Andrew on this achievement! It is clear he is not only a role model in education for his students and colleagues at Olathe Northwest, but also in the state of Kansas."

Taylor teaches biology in the Engineering Academy at Olathe Northwest, a four-year, STEM-focused program. The program admits students through an application process, and they take science and engineering courses with the same cohort each year. He also coaches the FIRST Robotics Team 1710, The Ravonics Revolution, which regularly excels at regional and national competitions. Taylor is known for promoting student curiosity and empowering students to be problem solvers.

"Learning in my classroom always starts with student questions as they observe phenomena such as infectious disease, cancer, and trendy workout regimens," Taylor said. "As I guided students through questioning strategies, I witnessed their thinking evolve as they made deeper observations, formulated their own questions, and developed explanations. While not all students will pursue science, the strategies learned and utilized in my classroom help every student engage their curiosity as they seek to understand the world around them."

Olathe Northwest Principal Chris Zuck expressed pride in Taylor's achievement, noting that this is the first time a teacher from the school has received the Kansas Master Teacher honor.

"We are so proud of Mr. Taylor and this major accomplishment," Zuck said. "Mr. Taylor spends countless hours at Olathe Northwest to lead and support student learning. Every day, he shows up with a commitment to excellence and a visionary approach that make him an incredible educator and uniquely qualified for this distinguished honor. Our school community and the greater Olathe community should take great pride in Mr. Taylor's contributions to our students."

Colleagues, administrators, and students wrote letters of nomination to support Taylor's selection. Hudson Hurtig, a 2022 Olathe Northwest graduate and former Robotics team member, wrote that Taylor had a profound impact on his life.

"By virtue of ingenuity in Mr. Taylor's classroom, there was seldom the question, 'When or how am I going to use this?" Hurtig said. "In every unit, there was a real-world problem we could point to and apply fundamental concepts to and imagine ourselves toward a better future. This fundamental strategy carried me far beyond high school and high school robotics. Less than two years later, I was giving my final presentation and was offered a full-time job at Tesla at 18 years old."

Through the support of the Bank of America Charitable Foundation, Taylor received a \$1,000 check. The 2025 Master Teachers were honored on Master Teacher Day this spring at Emporia State University.

GETTING KINDERGARTEN READY

As the first day of kindergarten approaches, preparing your child for this exciting milestone is key.

- Get enrolled! Please contact your child's future school to enroll in kindergarten.
- Prepare your child for kindergarten by establishing a consistent bedtime and wake-up routine a few weeks in advance to adjust to the school schedule.
- Read to your child and engage in fine-motor activity play such as painting, coloring, using scissors, or playing with Legos and blocks to develop essential skills.
- Encourage independence by practicing simple tasks like opening snack bags, putting
 on shoes, zipping up jackets, using the restroom, dressing themselves and using a
 water bottle.
- Establish a transportation plan and update all emergency contacts for a smooth start.
- Visit the school playground to familiarize your child with the environment in a fun way.





Starting kindergarten is an exciting milestone for children, filled with new friends, supportive teachers, and the thrill of structured learning. To help ease this transition, Olathe Public Schools has a special first-week program called "Camp Kindergarten," which introduces students to the basics of a school day through interactive play and activities with their grade-level classmates. This program, which has been a part of the district for over 15 years, is now districtwide, giving all kindergartners the opportunity to acclimate to their new environment.

- Connect with the school community during the first few weeks through communication with your child's teacher, following your school on social media or engaging with the Parent Teacher Organization.
- In the beginning, plan to spend quiet one-on-one time with your child and keep the family schedule simple to help with their adjustment to a busier schedule.
- Use these early weeks to help your child feel comfortable and confident as they begin their kindergarten journey.

SUPPORTING LEARNING

THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

Whether at home or at school, maintaining consistent attendance and connection are crucial to your child's academic success and social-emotional growth.

- Missing just 10% of school about one or two days every few weeks can significantly impact
 a child's ability to gain foundational reading and math skills, build relationships, and develop good
 attendance habits.
- Showing up on time every day sets your child up for success, ensuring they don't miss important lessons and social interactions that support their growth.
- Maintain open communication with your child's teacher to stay aligned on progress.
- Play! Make learning a part of everyday life by reading regularly to your child, encouraging play, and incorporating counting, letter recognition, and color identification into everyday activities.

OLATHE INNOVATION CAMPUS: A LOOK AHEAD

The Olathe Innovation Campus is set to redefine career and technical education with new, state-of-the-art facilities designed to meet the needs of today's students and tomorrow's industries. Thanks to the support of bond voters in April 2022, this new building will house six high-demand career pathways: Animal Science & Research, Culinary Arts, Construction Technology, Healthcare Sciences, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), and Electronics & Avionics.

The modern facility, built to industry standards, offers expanded space for increased enrollment and hands-on experience with the same equipment professionals use. Students will benefit from cutting-edge technology, specialized labs, and simulation spaces, including professional-grade kitchens and advanced avionics labs. The EMS and Healthcare Science academies will feature real-world medical simulation labs, while Construction Technology will have a large workshop adjacent to the district's Operations Service Center, allowing students to gain valuable internship experience with experts in their field.

The Olathe Innovation Campus will also house the district's HELP Clinic and the Olathe Transitions Supports Program (OTSP), which teaches life skills and work-based learning for students ages 18-21. With the move, the HELP Clinic will have increased capacity to see more students after school and during the summer for mental health services, play therapy space to support our youngest learners and flexibility to convert designated rooms from training spaces for mental health professionals to therapy spaces. OTSP will also gain a much-needed expanded space to meet the unique needs of

all students and will allow increased opportunities for students to work on independence and self-advocacy skills.

With a focus on sustainability, flexibility, and collaboration, the Olathe Innovation Campus is poised to provide students with the skills they need for success in the world's everchanging job market. The Olathe Innovation Campus is scheduled to be completed in the 2025-26 school year, with programs gradually moving from their respective buildings to the new campus.
